

## Founder Dr. James F. Goodwin, Jr.

James F. Goodwin, Jr., one of six children, was born in Kingston, Georgia, March 30, 1905, to Anna Sledge Goodwin and James F. Goodwin, Sr. He attended elementary school in Rome, Georgia and at the age of 12 moved with his parents north and settled in Steelton, PA. He continued grammar school and graduated from Steelton High School in 1924. Jimmy or "Brownie" as he was known, was determined

to go on to school and study medicine, so off he went to Howard University in Washington, D.C. September 1924. Of course no one believed that he was going to college because he only had enough money to last approximately a month. While in college he applied for scholarship aid through various sources and all of them refused, stating that due to their constitution he did not meet the requirements. It was this experience which inspired him to start a scholarship club which could and would help deserving Negro students who needed financial assistance.

James entered the college of Liberal Arts in 1924, graduated in 1934 from Howard University, Washington, D.C., (10 years), and served his internship at St. Louis, Missouri.

In September, 1935 he opened his office as a general practitioner in Bethlehem, PA.

The J. F. Goodwin Scholarship Club was founded in 1935 by Dr. J. F. Goodwin, who saw a great need in the Negro community of Bethlehem. Along with practicing medicine, he preached a gospel of education beyond high school to equip young people to meet the challenges of life. In 1940, Dr. Goodwin moved to Reading, PA where he continued his work with young Negro students, people and founded the sister club. During this period he married Elizabeth Waters. Dr. Goodwin found the time through the years to remain active in both clubs. He practiced medicine until his illness forced him to retire and he departed this life on March 28, 1973.



#### Mrs. Olivia Palmer Clark

Mr. and Mrs. Harry Clark became acquainted with Dr. James F. Goodwin after he moved to Bethlehem, PA. At that time he lived and maintained his practice from the home of Andrew Fauntleroy, which was located 2 doors down from the Clark home on Cherokee Street.

Most of the Scholarship Club meetings were held at the Clark home. After Dr. Goodwin moved to Reading, PA, a few years lapsed and the Bethlehem

students asked Mrs. Clark to start the Scholarship Club again. The Annual Graduation programs were very significant. Each student was expected to develop and present a graduation speech before the community and their parents. Everyone was encouraged to seek education beyond high school.

Mrs. Clark was responsible for the musical programs presented. She involved the parents, who sewed the costumes which she had designed. She taught the students to sing and dance, assisted by her daughter, Mrs. Audrey Blue. Anyone who had the least bit of talent and coordination was inducted. IT WAS LIKE BROADWAY! Everyone participated. These programs were developmental as well as fundraisers. Mrs. Clark was always an unselfish person—always giving of herself.

For those who found it difficult to attend, transportation was provided. The productions and programs were held at local black churches and the Jewish Community Center, then located on the corner of Packer and Brodhead Ave.

We here in Bethlehem are all the better today because of this Great Lady! - Mrs. Olivia Palmer Clark.

### History of the J. F. GOODWIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The J. F. Goodwin Scholarship Club was founded in 1935 by Dr. J. F. Goodwin, a young black physician who saw a great need in the black community of Bethlehem. Along with practicing medicine, he preached a gospel of education beyond high school to equip young people to meet the challenges of life. Years later Dr. Goodwin moved to Reading, PA where he continued his work with young black people and founded a sister club. Dr. Goodwin found the time throughout the years to remain active in both clubs. In 1956 the J. F. Goodwin Scholarship Fund was established to act as custodian for the Fund. The founding members were Mrs. Olivia Clark, Mr. William Walton, Mrs. Audrey Blue, Mrs. Rebecca Grimes Hatfield, Mr. Jacob White, Mrs. Lillian Taylor, Mr. Sampson Taylor, Mrs. Margaret Bowers. Honorary members were Mrs. Harry Clark and Mrs. Melvin Neff.

Over the years the J. F. Goodwin Scholarship Club, consisting of high school students remained active as an extracurricular club in the Bethlehem Area School District until the mid 1970's. The Board of Directors created goals and activities for the J. F. Goodwin Scholarship Club.

- To promote scholarship and develop culture in our community
- To promote better interracial understanding and fellowship
- To obtain scholarship aid, whenever possible, for our graduates
- To offer financial assistance to our students who are eligible for such aide
- To encourage advanced education
- To act as counselors in choice of vocation.
- To aid in character training in cooperation with the Bethlehem Area School District
- To uphold and promote the general interest in education

#### Eric Williams

Eric Williams was raised in Bethlehem, PA. He graduated from Liberty High School in 1987.

Engineering in 1992. Upon Graduating from Drexel, he began working at Lockheed Martin as a System Engineering while also taking graduate engineering courses at Virginia Tech. He earned his M.S. in Systems Engineering from Virginia Tech in 1995. Eric attended the University of Michigan in 1996 to begin working towards his Master of Business Administration, earning his degree in 1998.

After graduating from the University of Michigan, he worked as a management consultant for six years, advising executives at the largest telecommunications and high-tech companies including Verizon, AT&T, T-Mobile, and Western Union.

In 2006 after working as a management consultant, he founded Accounts International, an accounting and tax advisory services company.

In 2008 he founded The Obscidion Group, which provides management consulting services to commercial clients and Federal agencies.

#### Jerome Hatfield

Jerome Hatfield was appointed by President Barack Obama to serve as the Regional Administrator of FEMA Region II in November 2013. Region II is the most risk-prone region in the United States. As Regional Administrator he was responsible for managing all aspects of federal emergency management for



the States of New York and New Jersey; the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico; the Territory of the United States Virgin Islands; as well as the Native American Tribes in the Region.

Lieutenant Colonel and Deputy Superintendent of Homeland Security Jerome Hatfield (retired) is a 27 year veteran of the New Jersey State Police where he commanded more than 800 enlisted, professional and administrative staff while leading the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management as well as Special Operations Sections (Haz Mat, Urban Search and Rescue, Bomb Teams, K9, Swat Teams, Aviation and Marine). He integrated planning, analytics, tactics and operations into the Homeland Security spectrum. Additionally, he oversaw more than 80 state and federal grant programs. Hatfield has served as a member of the National Advisory Council to FEMA, and Chairman to the Emergency Management Accreditation Program (EMAP) responsible for conducting nationwide assessments of state, territorial, federal and local emergency management and homeland security programs.

In September 2005, Hatfield was deployed to the State of Louisiana with over 600 New Jersey responders in support of the response to Hurricane Katrina.

Hatfield holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree and is a graduate of the Center for Homeland Defense and Security, Naval Post Graduate School, Executive Leader's Program. Mr. Hatfield is a veteran of the United States Army and is a Certified Public Manager (CPM) awarded by Farleigh Dickinson University.

Jerome is a Bethlehem native and son of Steve Sr., and O. Rebecca Hatfield (deceased). Jerome and his wife, Pat, have to adult children, Tiffany and Brandon. He is a Liberty High School graduate, Class of 1977.


